

<b>Symptom</b>	<b>Keep child home until</b>
Fever	fever registers below 100° without medication for at least 24 hours and child is able to participate in normal daily activity
Runny Nose	thick yellow or green discharge is treated or clears up If child has a continual runny nose due to <b>allergies</b> , parent will need to have a doctor's note, stating this is the cause, on file at the preschool office
Flu Symptoms	symptoms have resolved
Vomiting or diarrhea	free from vomiting and able to keep food down for at least 24hours A child sent home with diarrhea must have a solid stool before returning.
Rash	a physician determines the cause and recommends returning to school A note from the child's doctor stating the rash is not contagious is required to readmit the child.
Severe or Productive Cough	coughing subsides or is no longer productive
Red or watery eyes	eyes return to normal
Pink Eye	no discharge and has been treated for at least 24 hours
Strep Throat	Taken an antibiotic for at least 24 hours
Draining Sore	until draining stops
Lice	no nits or lice present (Center staff must do a lice check before child enters the classroom)
Chicken Pox	The last area is scabbed over



Children who are being treated with antibiotics must complete a full 24 hours of treatment before they will be allowed to return to Preschool. This means if we send your child home at 11:00 am but you don't get antibiotics until 3:00 pm, they can not come back to school the next morning.
