15 Super Easy Volunteer/Service Ideas

- 1. Deliver baked goods to neighbors, friends, family, or essential workers (like nurses, police, fire fighters, postal workers, grocery workers, etc)
- 2. Offer to help do yard work for your family, friends, or neighbors (pick up leaves, pull weeds, etc)
- 3. Volunteer to help set up or clean up during a Family Launch night. Sign-up on the Family Launch section of the www.st-ann.org/launch website.
- 4. Make artwork and give it to neighbors, friends, family, essential workers, teachers, priests, or those in hospitals or nursing homes.
- 5. Donate old or new board games or decks of cards to homeless shelters.
- 6. Donate old or new clothes or toys to foster care groups, women's shelters, the church, or programs like Adopt-a-Family. (Launch is happy to take donations and distribute them, if needed)
- 7. Donate non-perishable food to St. Ann's Food Pantry. Leave bags of food at the parish office or the church narthex.
- 8. Make special homeless gift bags and give them out downtown or donate them to St. Ann's homeless organization, My Brother's Keeper. Bags are gallon Ziplocks filled with items like: socks, wipes, tissues, granola bars, water, disposable toothbrushes, etc.
- 9. Write thank you notes to those who serve or help you in your life: grandparents, postal worker, sanitation workers, grocery store clerks, teachers, doctors, church ushers, city workers, police station workers, school secretaries, etc.
- 10. Walk around your neighborhood, a local park, your school, or the church and bring a trash bag or grocery bag to pick up trash/litter.
- 11. Contact Linn Hodges in the Launch office at lhodges@st-ann.org to see if there are projects you can take home to help with, like sharpening pencils, etc.
- 12. Contact Maria Elena at the pastoral care office, mrodriguez@st-ann.org to see if you can cook a meal for someone who is homebound or recovering from surgery.
- 13. Bring wipes or get some from the church and help clean the pews in the church. They are FILTHY!!!
- 14. Help make cards for people who receive food bags from our St Vincent de Paul food pantry. Drop the cards off to the Launch office or the front parish office.
- 15. Volunteer at an animal shelter, like Good Mews. They have very simple jobs like petting the cats who are lonely or cleaning their litter boxes.
